

Safety Leadership for Supervisors

Overview

Supervisors and frontline managers play a vital role in achieving and maintaining safety in the workplace. They are key influences on the promotion of a culture in which safety is a priority and workplace injuries are not acceptable.

This workshop will develop the skills and knowledge necessary to meet legislative requirements, ensure a safe workplace and implement or monitor company Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) policies, procedures and programs.

Participants will gain an introduction to key practices and principles of safety and health at operational level, the communication of information and the application of risk management processes.

These skills and knowledge will assist supervisors in fulfilling their responsibilities of reducing incidents, injury and illness in the workplace.

Intended for

Supervisors or team leaders who require an understanding of OHS legislation and implementing safe systems of work.

Note: Participants must have a minimum of six months experience in a supervisory role.

- Use communication to liaise with clients, team members and other relevant parties
- Manage on-site safety
- Diagnose and solve routine and non-routine problems
- Apply leadership principles to the team
- Deliver a presentation to achieve meeting outcomes
- Assess and identify unacceptable risk
